

## What's up next around the "World"



Fantasy Springs will be the park's eighth port, which is DisneySea's version of themed lands.

There will be three themed lands and a new luxury hotel in this new expansion - Frozen Kingdom, Peter Pan's Never Land, Rapunzel's Forest and the Tokyo DisneySea Fantasy Springs Hotel (which Disney says will be integrated into the park with multiple dining venues and the finest accommodation experience at Tokyo Disney.)

The new Peter Pan's Never Land in Fantasy Springs will include two unique attractions, both featuring Tinker Bell. Guests can help Tinker Bell deliver packages across Pixie Hollow in Fairy Tinker Bell's Busy Buggies and join Peter Pan and Tinker Bell in a 3-D quest to save John from Captain Hook & his pirates in Peter Pan's Never Land Adventure. Rapunzel's Forest in Fantasy Springs will be home to a new attraction called Rapunzel's Lantern Festival, which Disney

describes as Rapunzel's 'best day ever' as she falls in love with Flynn Rider on a romantic boat ride to the annual lantern festival. Frozen Kingdom in Fantasy Springs will boast its new attraction, Anna and Elsa's Frozen Journey. This dark boat ride will feature the same storyline and familiar songs from the first "Frozen" film. 








**Keena:** What was the craziest or most touching display of dedication you saw in the parks in Tokyo? **Yoey:** ....oh, the whole culture! For example, for fireworks, they sat so organized and neatly, almost like in rows, to be sure they were not impeding on anyone's experience, so much respect for each other. There were no kids standing on walls or up on shoulders. The kids were so well-behaved. We saw one guest dressed as Belle who was unbelievable. We thought she was the real one and then realized she had her cell phone. LOL. She was willing to take pics with kids and adults also. **Nick:** They dressed to the nines there! We couldn't tell if they were a real character or a guest. They were all willing to take pics with kids and wanted to give back. I wondered if the kids were confused like

we were. LOL. **Keena:** What is it about the culture and atmosphere that normalizes positivity? **Yoey:** They are just respectable people. The cast members go over and beyond. They are just happy to be there. When I asked for water, a CM totally understood my English and walked 3-4 minutes with me to get water. The people were so friendly. Everyone was happy to be there. One interesting thing was that alcoholic beverages were not freely available. We found them in table service restaurants, but there were no Rose and Crown-type places to sit and relax with a drink. We just didn't see misbehavior from people who had been drinking.

**Nick**: It's their culture-don't know if it comes from their schooling or what, but they go there all the time rather than as a special vacation so maybe it's the price point difference. Every one followed the rules. Everything was so clean. No smoking zones were respected. The golden rule was evident.

**Keena:** What would it take for us to change our ways in our parks? Yoey: Different training?, Different ownership? More perks? Our cast members do go over and beyond also, but Tokyo was next level. It starts with management. The prices we have now, don't equal the quality we get. If guests walked around here in full character costumes, it would be just for attention and all about ME, not for the genuine love of Disney. The fandom was second to none and characters were walking freely everywhere. They spoke English. LOL. I said, "Hey, Mad Hatter!" and he turned around and said, "Hey how ya doin?!"

**Keena:** Did you see anyone get rude or angry toward a cast member or their family members? **Yoey:** Never. Occasionally a kid crying, never anyone arguing. Never anyone being disrespectful to a

**Nick:** That's a much bigger problem than we can address in the parks. People don't realize the level it

CM. Everyone was there to have a great time including all the workers. Nick: Never.... unless it was in Japanese. LOL. Wherever there was long line, people were just waiting patiently. The environment was so pleasant, no humidity and high temps to deal with. I would totally go back just to spend time in the city. Generally, families would need 2-3 days in the parks. **THERE IT IS!** Maybe we should take lessons in courteous and kind behavior from the people of Japan.


